MOTHER MONICA'S

Message



Dear St. Paul's friends:

When our Lenten journey began on Ash Wednesday, as your priest and pastor, I invited you "in the name of the Church...to make a right beginning of repentance". We do this, the Church teaches us, by "self examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting and self-denial and by reading and meditating on God's Holy Word." In my message at the beginning of Lent, I urged us to embrace Lent instead of enduring it. And over these past weeks, we have shared in Eucharist, in fellowship, and in prayerful study together.

Lent this year has been somewhat unusual. This solemn time of penitence has been marked by some very important celebrations in our community. We welcomed baby Grant in baptism just before Lent started and we welcomed Bishop Matt for a visit and celebrated new members while at the same time rejoicing in the ministry of Bill and Amy Dunlop. I suggest this gave us a new paradigm: that our Lenten season, while a time of reflection and making right our relationship with God and neighbor, can also be a time of quiet joy. Joy in our ministry together.

As we move toward the end of Lent, we each have a wonderful opportunity to walk alongside Jesus during Holy Week, the services which commemorate the last week of his ministry. Our schedule of services gives us opportunities all week long to share in the journey which leads to the Cross and our salvation.

I urge you to plan to join us--these are some of the most meaningful and beautiful services of the church year. Each one is different. Come, embrace Holy Week, and prepare for the joy of the Resurrection on Easter Sunday. And bring a friend or family member with you!

Episco-Speak Get Your Questions Answered Here!

If you are new-ish to the Episcopal Church, or even if you are a long time member, you may have questions about some of our vocabulary, or why we do things the way we do...don't despair, you are not alone! Many of our worship traditions are rooted in the early Christian church, as handed down to us through the Roman Catholic and some of the Reformation traditions. A lot of our vocabulary came first from Greek and Latin and then from England- which is where what became the Episcopal Church originated. Each month we will feature a weird word or two, or explain a tradition that you may wonder about. Got a question? Email it to Mother Monica to be answered in a future segment.

What do we call the parts of the church worship space? The inside of the church is built in the shape of the cross and is divided into three main sections: the entry area (between our front doors) is known as the narthex. The part inside the second set of doors where the congregation sits is called the nave. The place where the two parts of the cross connect near the front (called the transept) by the altar (there is a special decorative tile there) is called the crossing.. and the front area by the altar is called the sanctuary or the chancel.






Join Us for Drop-In Group Voice Lessons!






































A donation basket is at the back of the church for any donation drop offs. Monetary donations can be put in the offering plate.
